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1. PURPOSE

The purpose of the Quality Assurance Policy for Education and Training of Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy (hereinafter referred to as the Academy) is to ensure and continuously improve the quality of educational activities and higher education. As a leading institution of military education, the Academy seeks to train specialists capable of professional fulfilment in accordance with modern requirements and employer expectations, integrate with NATO educational standards, develop practical skills in military systems management, combine education with scientific research, enhance academic culture and the Academy's reputation, and ensure compliance with national and international standards of education quality.

2. BACKGROUND

The primary mission of the Academy is to shape the military elite of Ukraine—capable of decisive action to defend Ukrainian statehood—and to prepare highly qualified officers and non-commissioned officers, researchers, and educators. The Academy supports the Armed Forces of Ukraine and other Defence Forces components in preparing for Ukraine's accession to NATO, and contributes to the implementation of decisions by the country's military and political leadership in responding to national security and defence challenges and threats.

Mission of the Academy

Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy is a higher military educational institution that trains the officers of the future. Through synchronisation of military education with the realities of the battlefield, innovative solutions, and modern military doctrines, the Academy trains a new generation of leaders—not merely highly skilled military professionals, but individuals who are physically and intellectually developed, capable of critical thinking, and resilient to psychological and information influence. These are commanders with civic awareness and patriotic values, who can make important decisions, act effectively under complex conditions, contribute to societal transformation, and shape the future of the nation.

The Academy develops an officer corps that forms the core of Ukraine's elite and intelligentsia both on the battlefield and in civilian life, capable of thinking both tactically and strategically, ensuring stability, security, and the country's development in the face of modern challenges and future transformations.

Vision of the Academy

By 2030, the Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy will have become the leading military university of Ukraine, internationally recognised as a key centre of military education, innovation, and elite development. The Academy will attract the most talented Ukrainian youth, creating an environment where future military, political, civic, and business leaders are shaped.

The Academy will serve as a benchmark among higher military education institutions in Ukraine, recognised by peer institutions within NATO member states, and a role model in specific fields of activity and innovative projects. It will be the central platform for the advanced training of officer personnel for Ukraine's Defence Forces, aligned with modern military standards and future challenges.

Additionally, the Academy will act as Ukraine's leading centre for innovation, scientific research, and development of approaches and technologies that directly impact national defence capability.

The Academy's policy is implemented within Ukraine's higher education system through adherence to documents related to the quality assurance of educational activities and higher education (Appendix 1), and is based on the principles of internal quality assurance.

3. SCOPE OF APPLICATION

This Policy applies to all participants in the educational process. It is mandatory for all individuals involved in the implementation of educational programmes and the functioning of the Academy as a higher education institution.

4. POLICY STATEMENT

The Academy recognises the quality of educational activities and higher education as one of its strategic development priorities.

The Academy is committed to:

Ensuring a high standard of education in accordance with the legislation of Ukraine, higher education standards, and the standards and procedures adopted by NATO member states, through the implementation of mechanisms for continuous improvement of the educational process;

Guaranteeing academic integrity among all participants in the educational process through the operation of an effective system for preventing and detecting academic plagiarism;

Integrating combat experience and the experience of training and joint employment of defence forces into the content of educational programmes, in line with the current needs of the Armed Forces of Ukraine and NATO member states' practices;

Ensuring openness, transparency, and systematisation in the development, implementation, monitoring, and review of educational programmes, with the involvement of stakeholders such as employers, graduates, and programme initiators;

Supporting the professional development of staff, enhancing the qualifications of academic and teaching personnel, and promoting scientific activity and pedagogical excellence;

Ensuring the effective operation of an internal quality assurance system by clearly delineating responsibilities among participants in the educational process, conducting regular monitoring, surveys, performance ratings, and analysis of results;

Promoting a culture of quality within the Academy by upholding the principles of academic freedom, gender equality, ethics in academic relations, and equal access to education.

This policy serves as the foundation for the Academy's operations and is subject to regular review and refinement in response to changes in legislation, higher education standards, the external environment, and stakeholder needs.

5. PRINCIPLES OF EDUCATION AND TRAINING QUALITY ASSURANCE

The Academy's quality system is built on mechanisms of continuous improvement, which are essential for adapting to change and new challenges. The assurance of the quality of educational activities is based on the following principles:

The Academy's responsibility for the quality of educational services and their assurance;

Systematic, coherent, consistent, and logical integration of components of the educational process;

A balanced combination of rights, responsibilities, and accountability among participants in the educational process, fostering a strong institutional culture;

Fair competition, openness, transparency, and equality;

Academic freedom of all participants in the educational process;

Consideration of the needs and expectations of learners, stakeholders, and employers;

Support for the development of a culture of educational quality and academic integrity;

Objectivity and impartiality in the assessment of participants in the educational process;

Compliance with European and national standards for quality assurance in higher education, as well as relevant professional standards;

Integration into the international educational and research community;

Measurability of educational quality indicators.

6. EDUCATION AND TRAINING QUALITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

6.1. Organisation

To ensure a high level of education and training, the Academy has implemented a quality management system aimed at the continuous improvement of educational activities and training under conditions of change and new challenges (Appendix 2 - RACI).

The primary responsibility for quality assurance in education and training rests

with the Commandant of the Academy. All parties involved in the educational process—including academic staff, instructors, cadets, and students—contribute to its ongoing improvement.

The roles and responsibilities of all participants in the educational process are outlined in the "Regulations on the Organisation of the Educational Process at Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy."

The Academy's education and training quality management system includes the following key components (Appendix 3):

Inspection – conducted to identify and correct errors before they lead to problems. It includes:

Self-assessment;

Monitoring of teaching performance;

Inspection of the material and technical base;

Course correction during delivery.

Quality control – based on a systematic approach to identifying and resolving issues at each stage of the process. It includes:

Learner assessment:

Stakeholder feedback:

Training delivery monitoring;

Course correction after completion.

Quality assurance – focuses on extending responsibility for outcomes and includes:

Development of procedures (instructions) ("Regulations on the Internal Quality Assurance System");

Analysis of training effectiveness indicators;

Programme review;

Recruitment of teaching and permanent staff; Junior teachers development programme;

Information system;

Internal process evaluation.

Quality management – ensures:

Focus on the needs and expectations of stakeholders;

Inclusion of all institutional components;

Engagement of every individual;

Consideration of all aspects of quality;

Development of approaches to improve quality. It includes:

Quality management, annual review, and improvement;

Analysis of key training effectiveness indicators;

Engagement of internal and external stakeholders;

Professional development of permanent staff;

Public information and communication.

The Academy's education and training quality management system requires procedures for:

Quality assurance;

Quality control;

Quality assessment.

6.2. Functions and Areas of Responsibility

The assurance of the quality of educational activities and higher education encompasses the following functions (Appendix 4):

Analytical and forecasting;

Planning;

Regulatory and advisory;

Monitoring and diagnostic.

The Academy has established an Education and Training Quality Management Team (hereinafter – the Management Team), composed of designated officials accountable to the Commandant and operating under the principles of quality assurance in education and training.

6.2.1. Composition of the Management Team

The Management Team includes:

The Commandant of the Academy, the Supervisory Board, the Academic Council, the First Deputy Commandant, Deputy Commandants for Academic Affairs, Research, Logistics, and Armaments, the Head of the Scientific and Methodological Department for Quality Assurance of Educational Activities and Higher Education, the Head of the Educational Department, the Head of the Scientific and Organisational Department, the Head of the Educational and Laboratory Support Department, Heads of Departments and Faculties, the Head of the International Cooperation Department, the Head of the Personnel and Administrative Department, the Commandant's Adviser on Gender Issues, the Head of the Information and Computing Centre, the designated Anti-Corruption Officer, customers for the training of military professionals, employers, educational programme guarantors, and learners (Appendix 5).

6.2.2. Tasks of the Management Team

Responsibility for quality assurance in education lies with the Management Team. Their authority is defined in the "Regulations on the Internal Quality Assurance System for Educational Activities and Higher Education at Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy".

The overall responsibility for the functioning of the quality assurance system at the Academy is vested in the Scientific and Methodological Department for Quality Assurance of Educational Activities and Higher Education, which organises necessary processes, collects data, and prepares recommendations for decision-making at all levels of Academy governance.

The Management Team convenes to discuss specific topics related to educational quality at the direction of the Commandant (or Deputy Commandant for Academic Affairs) or at the suggestion of the Head of the Scientific and Methodological Department for Quality Assurance of Educational Activities and Higher Education.

7. STRATEGY FOR IMPLEMENTING THE ACADEMY'S EDUCATION AND TRAINING QUALITY ASSURANCE POLICY

7.1. Policy Implementation

The Academy's policy on education and training quality assurance is implemented through:

Integration of quality objectives and principles into the educational process at all levels of governance;

Approval of quality assurance procedures governing the development, implementation, monitoring, and review of educational programmes;

Involvement of all structural units, teaching staff, learners, employers, and training customers;

Continuous improvement of the internal quality assurance system in response to changes in the regulatory framework and current challenges.

7.2. Monitoring and Control of Policy Implementation

Control is exercised through:

Monitoring the quality of educational programmes;

Monitoring compliance with academic integrity standards;

Inspection of the material and technical support for the educational process;

Rating-based evaluation of learners and academic staff;

Annual self-assessment of educational programmes;

Monitoring adherence to educational standards;

Evaluating the effectiveness of the integration of combat experience and NATO standards.

7.3. Periodic Review of the Policy

The policy is reviewed at least once a year, or in the event of significant changes in Ukrainian legislation, recommendations from the National Agency for Higher Education Quality Assurance (NAQA), NATO guidelines, or internal challenges at the Academy (e.g., survey results, inspections, etc.).

The outcomes of the review are formalised as proposals to the Academy's Academic Council regarding necessary amendments and are approved by order of the Commandant.

7.4. Feedback Collection, Analysis, and Summary Process

The Academy has established a stable process for data collection through:

Surveys of learners, academic staff, and employers;

Focus groups, interviews, and questionnaires;

Analysis of knowledge assessment results, accreditation outcomes, and feedback from the armed forces;

Preparation of analytical materials and reports by area.

Based on the collected data, proposals for the improvement of the educational process are developed.

- 1. % of graduates appointed to command positions in the Armed Forces of Ukraine within two years after graduation;
- 2. Number of officer graduates involved in operational and strategic levels of planning;
- 3. Level of employer (AFU) satisfaction with graduate training (based on surveys).

Strategic Goal 2: Strengthening the Academy's Position as an Attractive Workplace for Leading Ukrainian Professionals

KPIs:

- 1. Average competition per one academic/research staff position;
- 2. % of vacancies held by staff with academic degrees;
- 3. Staff satisfaction level with working conditions (based on internal surveys);
- 4. Staff turnover (indirect risk).

Strategic Goal 3: Development of the Alumni Community as a Tool to Strengthen the Academy's Influence on the Ukrainian Military and Society **KPIs:**

- 1. Number of active alumni in the Academy's alumni community;
- 2. Number of projects/initiatives implemented with alumni participation;
- 3. Frequency of alumni engagement in the educational process (lectures, trainings, etc.).

Strategic Goal 4: Academy's Physical Space as an Example of Aesthetic, Functional, and Barrier-Free Military Higher Education Institution

KPIs:

- 1. Percentage of renovated/repaired premises in accordance with barrier-free design principles;
- 2. Evaluation of aesthetics and functionality among cadets and staff (based on survey results);
- 3. Number of created/modernized open spaces for study and recreation.

Strategic Goal 5: Flexible, Adaptive, and Relevant Educational Process **KPIs:**

- 1. Percentage of academic programs updated in accordance with changes in military doctrine;
- 2. Number of external experts involved in course development;
- 3. Average time to adapt academic programs based on combat experience;
- 4. Number of new training technologies/simulations.

Strategic Goal 6: The Best Training Ground in Ukraine, the Largest Practical Training Base

KPIs:

- 1. Number of practical exercises conducted at the training ground per year;
- 2. Number of Armed Forces of Ukraine (AFU) units trained at the training base;
- 3. Level of training ground equipment (percentage of planned technical solutions implemented).

Strategic Goal 7: Brand of the Academy as the Most Recognizable and Understandable Military Educational Institution **KPIs:**

- 1. Level of brand recognition of the Academy among applicants and military personnel (%);
- 2. Number of mentions of the Academy in national and international media;
- 3. Growth in followers and engagement on the Academy' official social media platforms.

Strategic Goal 8: Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy as a Partner Institution

KPIs:

- 1. Number of signed cooperation agreements with domestic and international institutions;
- 2. Number of joint educational/scientific projects with partners;
- 3. Number of cadets involved in international exchange programs.

8. QUALITY ASSURANCE REVIEW CYCLE

The quality assurance review cycle at the Academy is based on the principle of continuous improvement in educational activities and relies on systematic, step-by-step monitoring of all components of the educational process.

The main stages of the quality assurance review cycle include:

Planning and defining quality standards

Establishing strategic goals, principles, and procedures for education quality; Defining expected learning outcomes in accordance with higher education standards, international requirements, and employer needs.

Implementation of educational programmes

Conducting the educational process in line with approved programmes; Ensuring academic integrity among all participants in the process; Supporting the learning environment through adequate material, technical, informational, and organizational resources.

Monitoring and data collection

Annual evaluation of student learning outcomes;

Monitoring the status of educational programmes, academic integrity, and the material and technical base;

Gathering analytical data through surveys, testing, focus groups, and residual knowledge assessments;

Ongoing analysis of the quality of teaching and managerial performance.

Analysis and evaluation of results

Comparing actual results with established standards;

Identifying problem areas and analysing the effectiveness of applied methods;

Reviewing results at the level of departments, faculties, and academic-methodological councils.

Corrective actions and improvement

Amending educational programmes, curricula, and methodological materials;

Enhancing the qualifications of academic staff;

Improving infrastructure, information systems, and control procedures;

Developing and approving new internal regulations.

Transparency and public availability of results

Open access to monitoring results via the Academy's website and internal resources;

Informing stakeholders (students, teaching staff, employers, and training customers) about inspection results and decisions taken.

Frequency of reviews

Monitoring of educational programmes – annually;

Evaluation of teaching quality – annually;

Academic integrity checks – ongoing;

Analysis of the material and technical base – annually;

Student rating evaluations – annually.

Responsible entities for implementation

Scientific and Methodological Department for Quality Assurance of Educational Activities and Higher Education;

Departments, faculties, academic and scientific-organizational divisions; Other structural units in accordance with their functional responsibilities.

9. SUPPORTING ELEMENTS AND RESOURCES FOR EDUCATION AND TRAINING QUALITY ASSURANCE

9.1. Educational Activity Planning Process

The planning process must be predictable, systematic, and directly aligned with meeting the requirements of key stakeholders. The Academy applies a systemic approach to educational planning, which comprises four stages: needs assessment (analysis and design), development, implementation, and performance monitoring.

The Academy adheres to the guiding principles of a systematic approach, adapted to specific circumstances and requirements.

9.2. Student Assessment

At the Academy, assessment of student learning outcomes in educational components during study and final attestation is carried out in accordance with the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS). Key elements of the system include credit units as a measure of workload and learning quality, and a stimulating rating-based assessment system.

The mechanism for implementing the rating-based assessment system, procedures for conducting assessments, and the application of rating evaluation during attestation are determined by the Academy.

Assessment of learning outcomes includes the full range of control measures outlined in the course syllabus.

The detailed process of student assessment is described in the Regulations on the Organisation of the Educational Process at the Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy.

Students have the right to appeal the results of final assessments. The procedures for appealing assessment results and for re-taking assessments are specified in the Regulations on Appealing the Results of Assessment Measures and Re-taking Assessments at the Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy.

Науково-педагогічні (педагогічні) працівники підвищують кваліфікацію відповідно до "Положення про підвищення кваліфікації та стажування педагогічних і науковопедагогічних працівників Національної академії сухопутних військ імені гетьмана Петра Сагайдачного" та нормативно-правової бази України.

9.3. Development of Staff and Academic (Teaching) Personnel

Professional development of scientific and academic (teaching) staff is a purposeful and continuous process of improving professional competencies and pedagogical skills, essential for acquiring knowledge that enhances the quality of managerial, educational, methodological, research, innovative, creative, and educational activities at the Academy.

Academic staff enhance their qualifications in accordance with the Regulations on the Professional Development and Internships of Teaching and Academic Staff of Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy and the legal and regulatory framework of Ukraine.

The following provisions:

Establish clear, transparent, and fair procedures for recruitment and employment conditions;

Promote support for scientific activity to strengthen the link between research and education;

Ensure monitoring of the quality of scientific research conducted by academic staff;

Encourage innovation in teaching methods and the use of new technologies;

Define pathways for professional development of teaching and academic staff, and enhance the system for developing teaching competencies in early-career instructors and researchers:

Ensure regular performance evaluations of academic and teaching personnel.

9.4. Learning Resources and Student Support

Material and technical (logistical) support for the educational process is provided by the relevant services responsible for identifying, ordering, and receiving military educational property.

Each year, during the monitoring of educational programmes, an analysis is conducted to assess the adequacy of the material and technical base in relation to the content of military specialist training. Based on the results, the development and improvement of the material and technical base are planned. As part of this process, the Educational and Laboratory Support Department prepares a Five-Year Development and Improvement Plan for the Academy's Material and Technical Base.

The development of this Plan involves departments, faculties, divisions and services, and Deputy Commandants of the Academy.

Responsibility for ensuring the implementation of the Development Plan lies with the Deputy Commandants of the Academy for Academic Affairs, Armaments, and Logistics.

9.5. Information Systems and Knowledge Management

The management of the educational process at the Academy is supported by certified in Ukraine software systems and the Unified State Electronic Database on Education (USEDE).

The informatization of the Academy aims to optimise educational processes and automate core functions such as planning, organising, controlling the educational process, and supporting management activities.

Information support for higher education activities is developed in compliance with the technological requirements of licensing conditions for educational activities.

The Academy's information systems operate using the following resources:

Official website, which provides essential information on the Academy's activities;

Internal electronic platform on MOODLE, containing educational and methodological materials, library resources, and internal documents;
